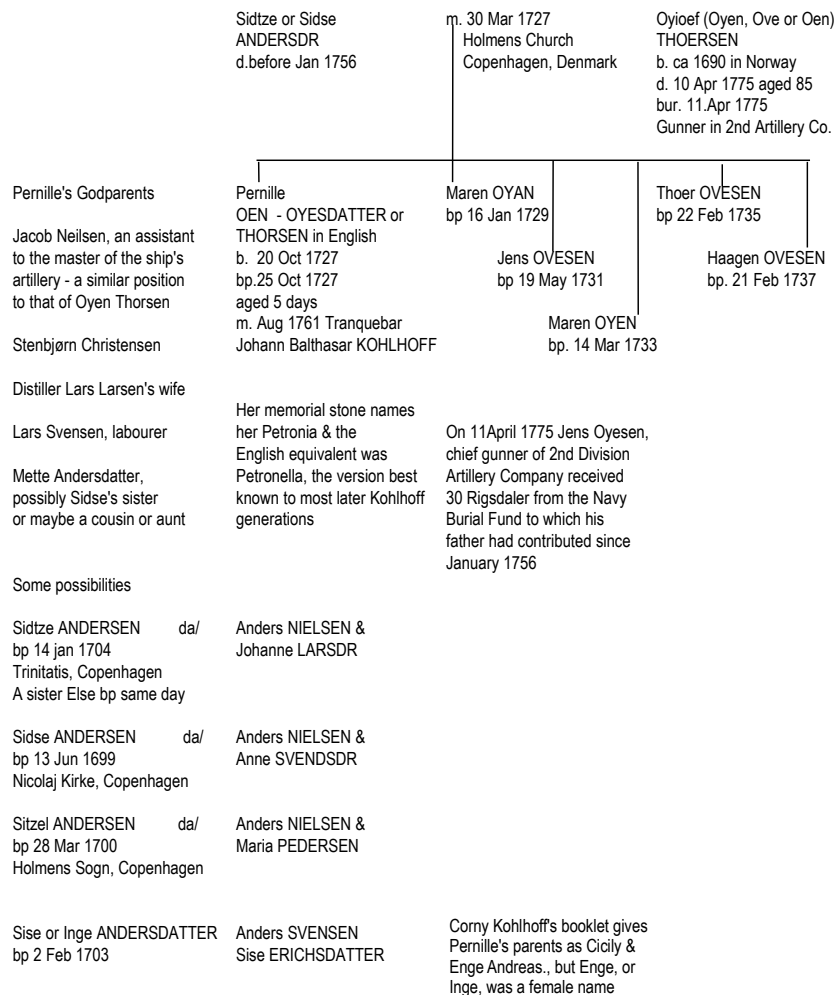


In search of the Thorsens



The Murray Family - from Scotland

Possible Clues

6th May 1799. John Murray. Lieutenant-Colonel, Commander of the 1st Regiment of the Native Cavalry in the Honourable East India Company's service. Aged 50 years.. According to the Asiatic Annual Register "he died at Athoor on his way from the grand army to the coast, for the recovery of a constitution, worn out in the service of his country". On June 27 1789 he married Miss Ann Chase, who died 30th December 1811, aged 56 and was buried in Kensington Church. Her sister Rebecca married Henry Sewell.

Just for interest:-  
A Madras listing - 18 May 1800 Henry Sewell aged 39 years, late His Majesty's Naval Officer at this port and an alderman of this corporation. He married June 5th 1790 Miss Rebecca Chase who died August 24th 1824. He joined his brother-in-law Thomas Chase in establishing the firm of Chase, Chinnery & Sewell which failed in 1822.

If this is the right father for Margaret, he must have married a second time. Margaret would have been about 8 years old in 1789.
