

**XTD 3 - HORST**

Jobst Der HORST grew up in Burghasungen in a Hessen-Cassell Gute He died about 1730

Christoph Heinrich Horst spent his childhood in Wittenburg & Bliestorf, moving to Ratzeburg in 1776 where he attended the church school until 1779. He entered Göttingen University as a medical student 26 April 1781. Göttingen was at the southern end of the Electorate of Hannover so Christoph may have enlisted while at uni. He embarked 3 Jan 1787 & arrived in India at the end of May 1787 as a corporal & surgeon in the or 14th Hannoverian Regiment. He was interested in the work of the missions & offered his services as a teacher, working first at Cuddalore & then at Tanjore where he was ordained 30 Nov 1806. He worked with John Caspar Kohlhoff until his early death in 1810 soon after his son Christian Daniel was born.

Jobst possibly held a government position which enabled his sons to obtain government jobs. Anton seems to have obtained his job by asking the Oberlandbaumeister Of Hannover, Hr Otto von Bonn in about 1740.

Mme Redeckern appears on Christoph Heinrich's baptismal record. Maybe she was his mother's sister? Or an older cousin? Or a daughter of Aunt Sophie perhaps?
